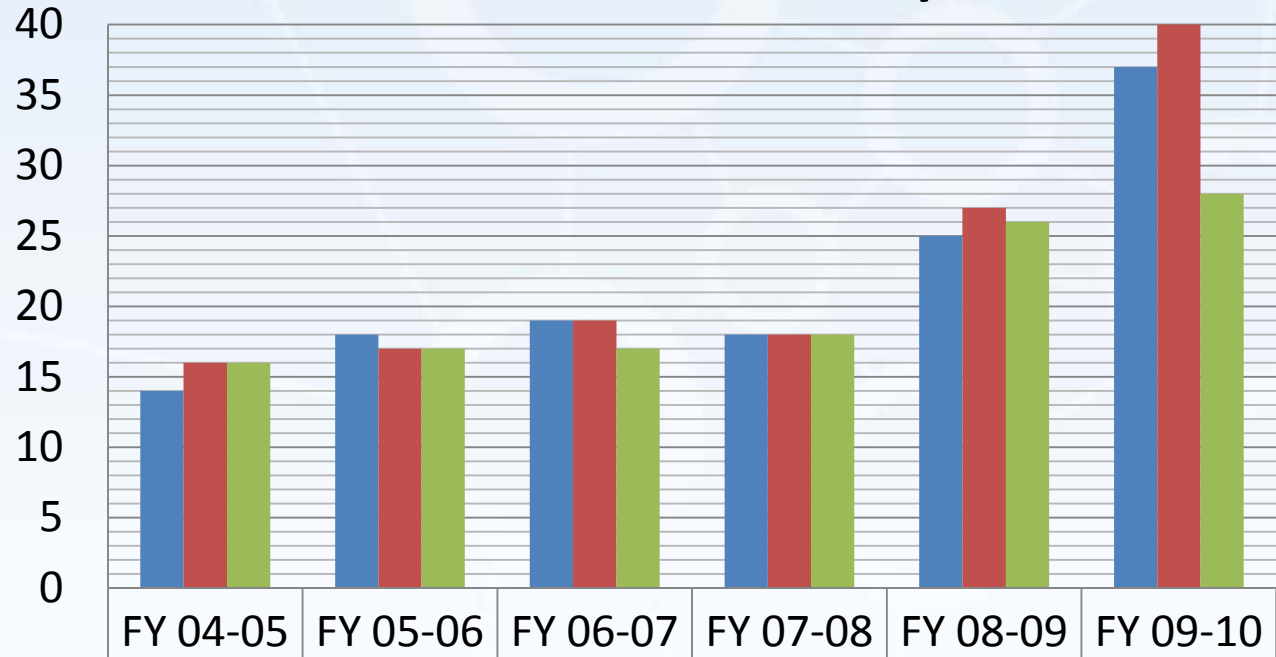

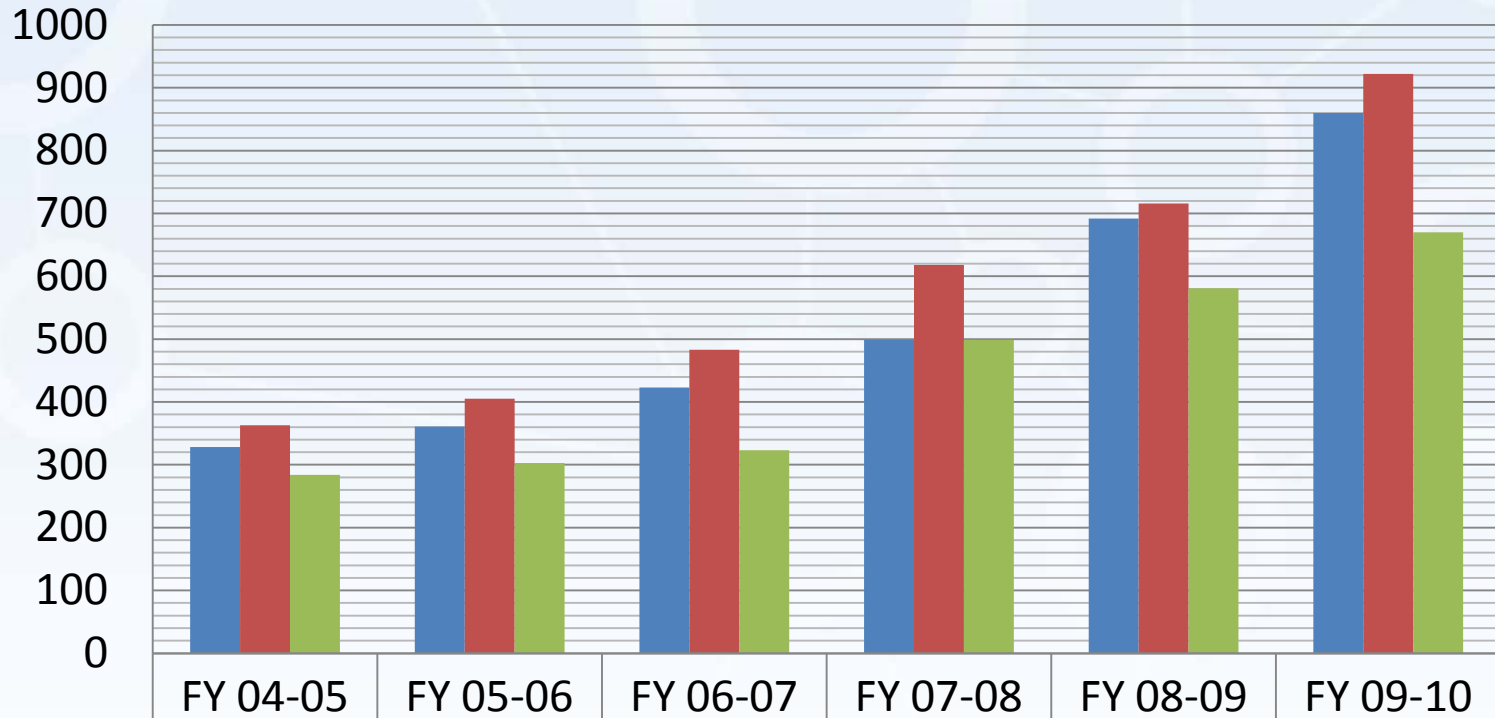

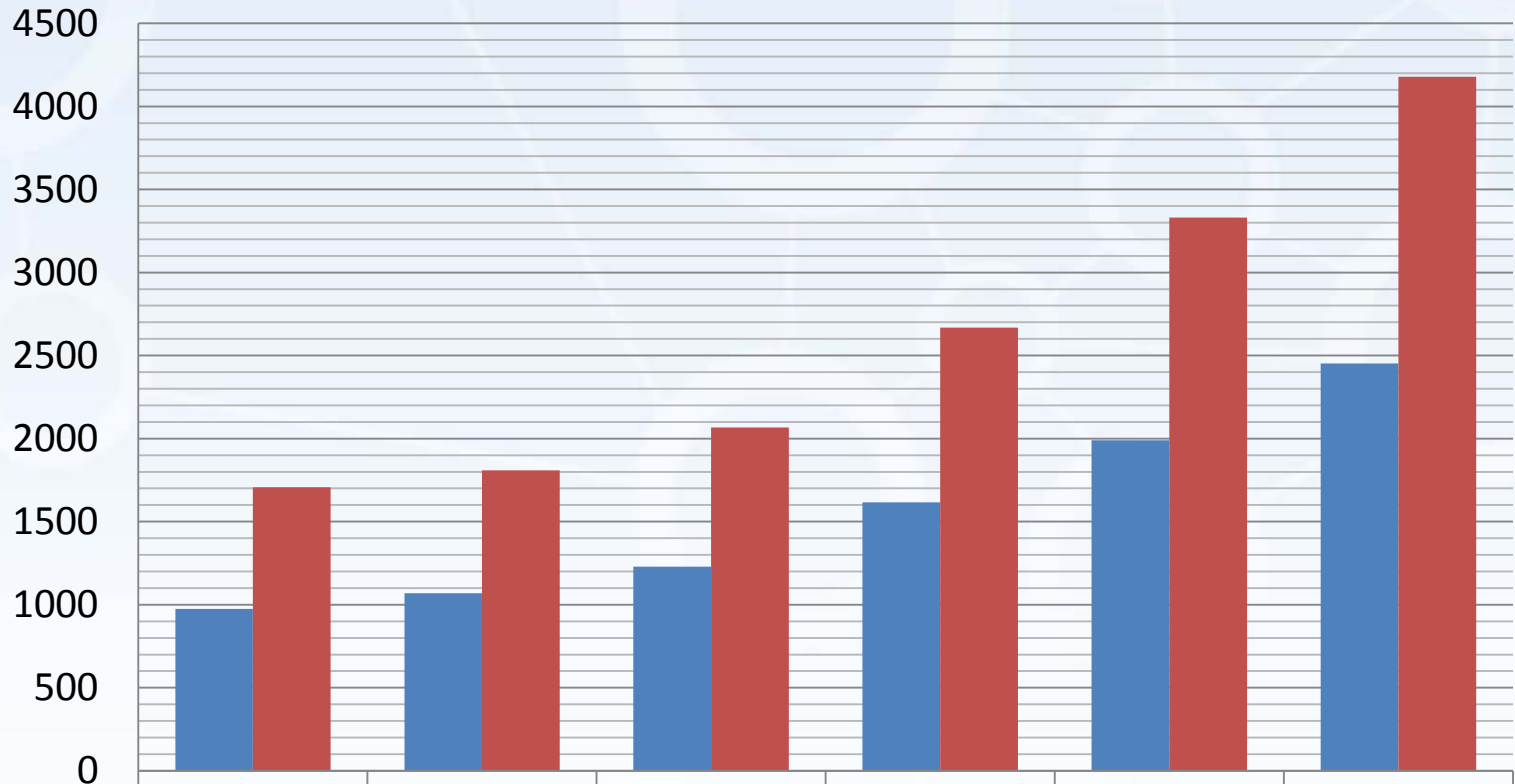

## RODP Student Counts for Columbia State



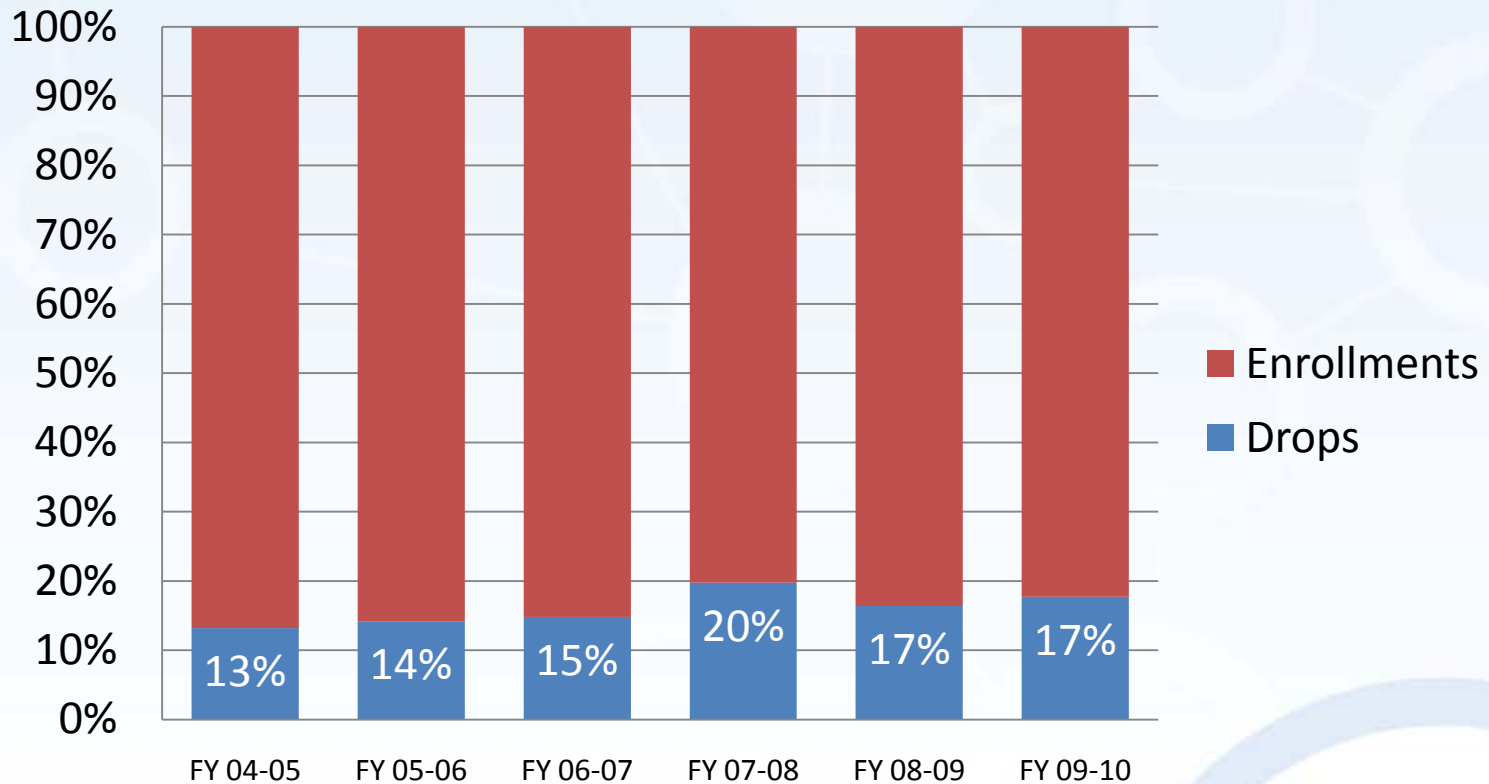

## RODP Student Count/Enrollments for Columbia State

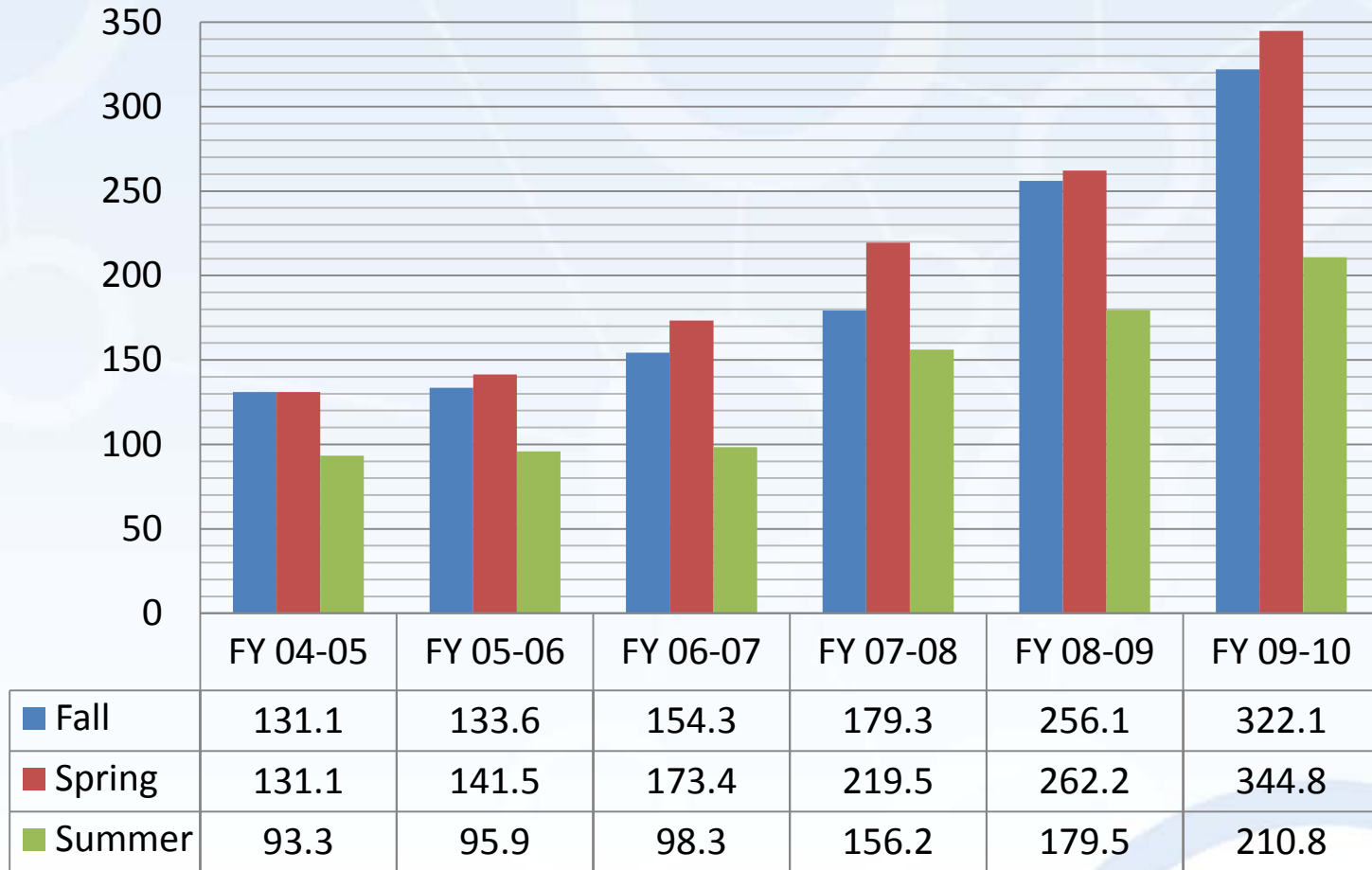

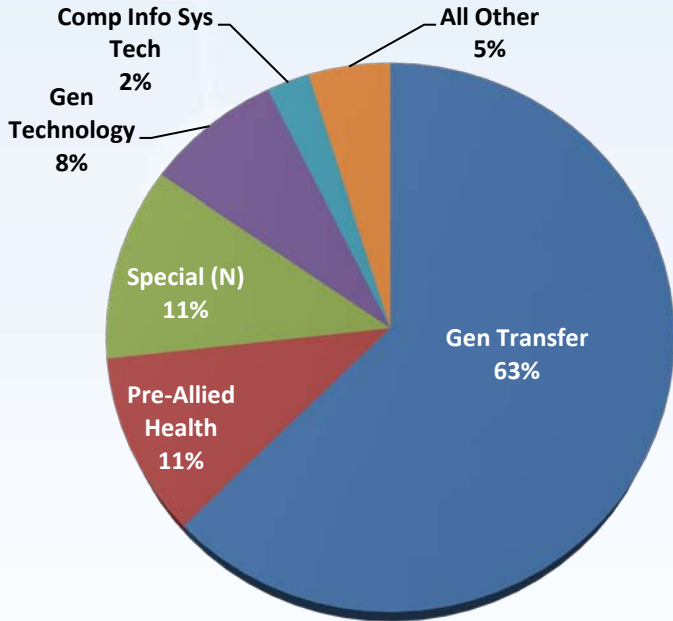
## RODP Student Drop History for Columbia State



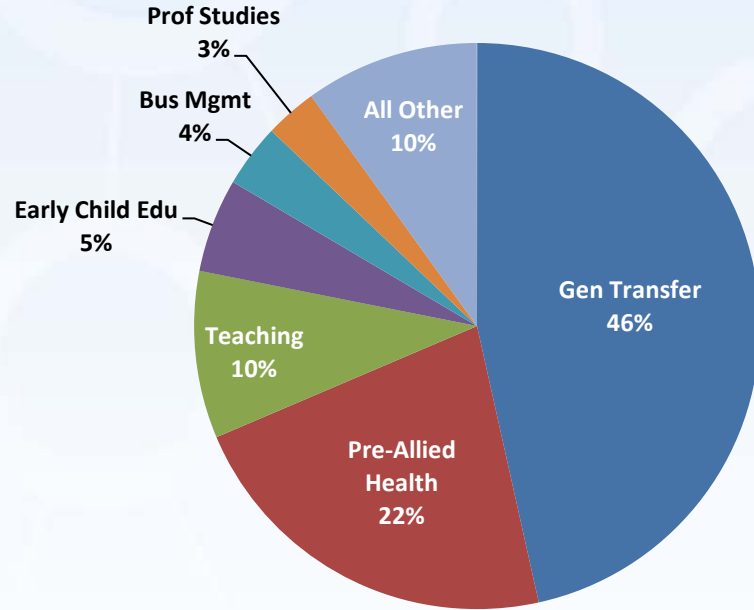
## Full-time Student Equivalents for Columbia State



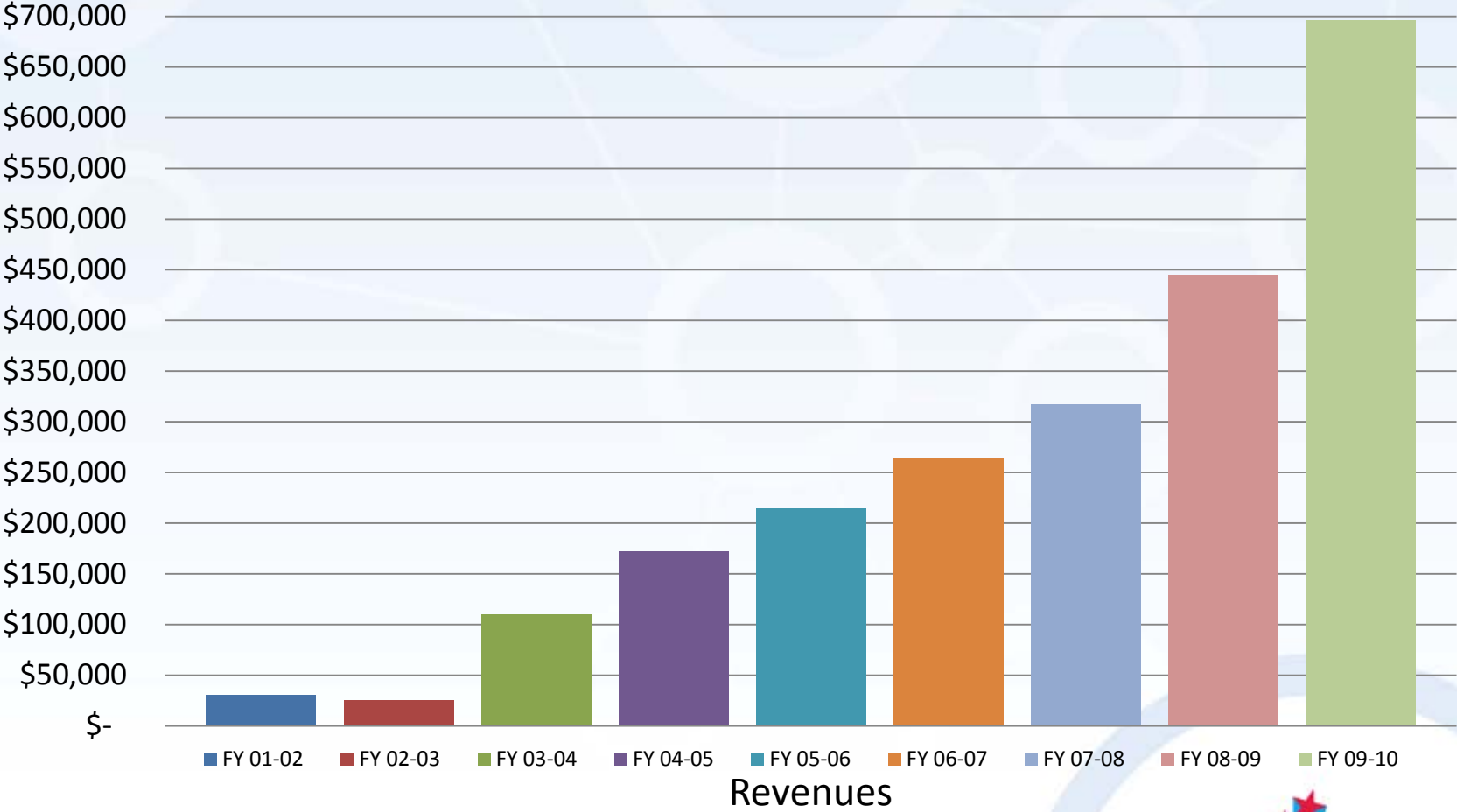
**FY 04-05 RODP Enrollments by Major at Columbia State**



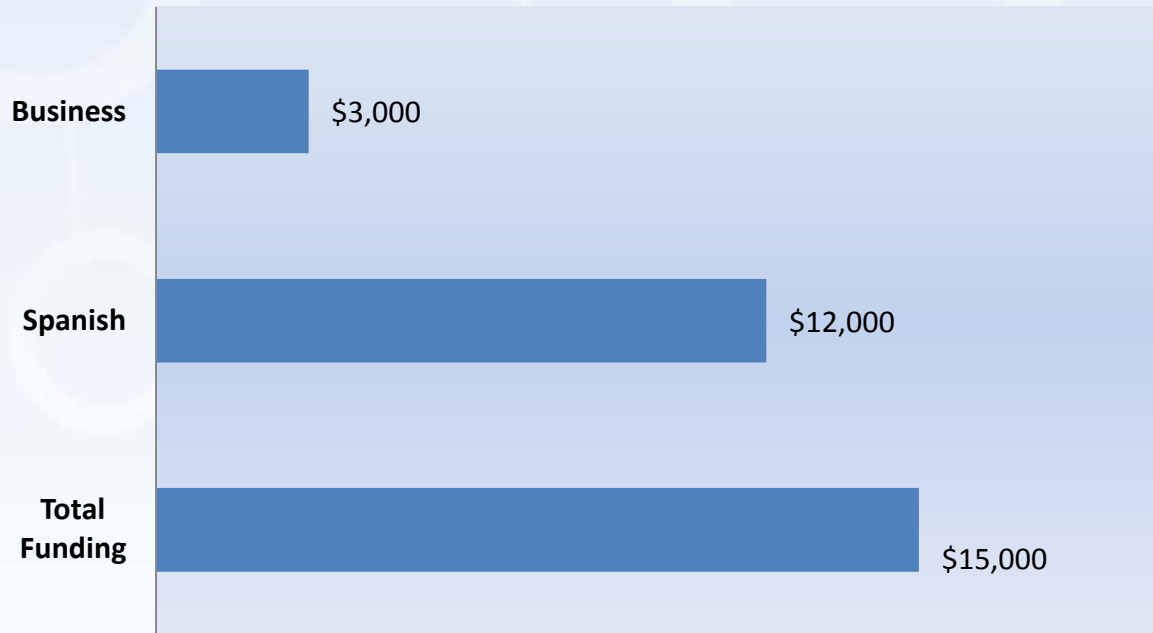
**FY 09-10 RODP Enrollments by Major at Columbia State**

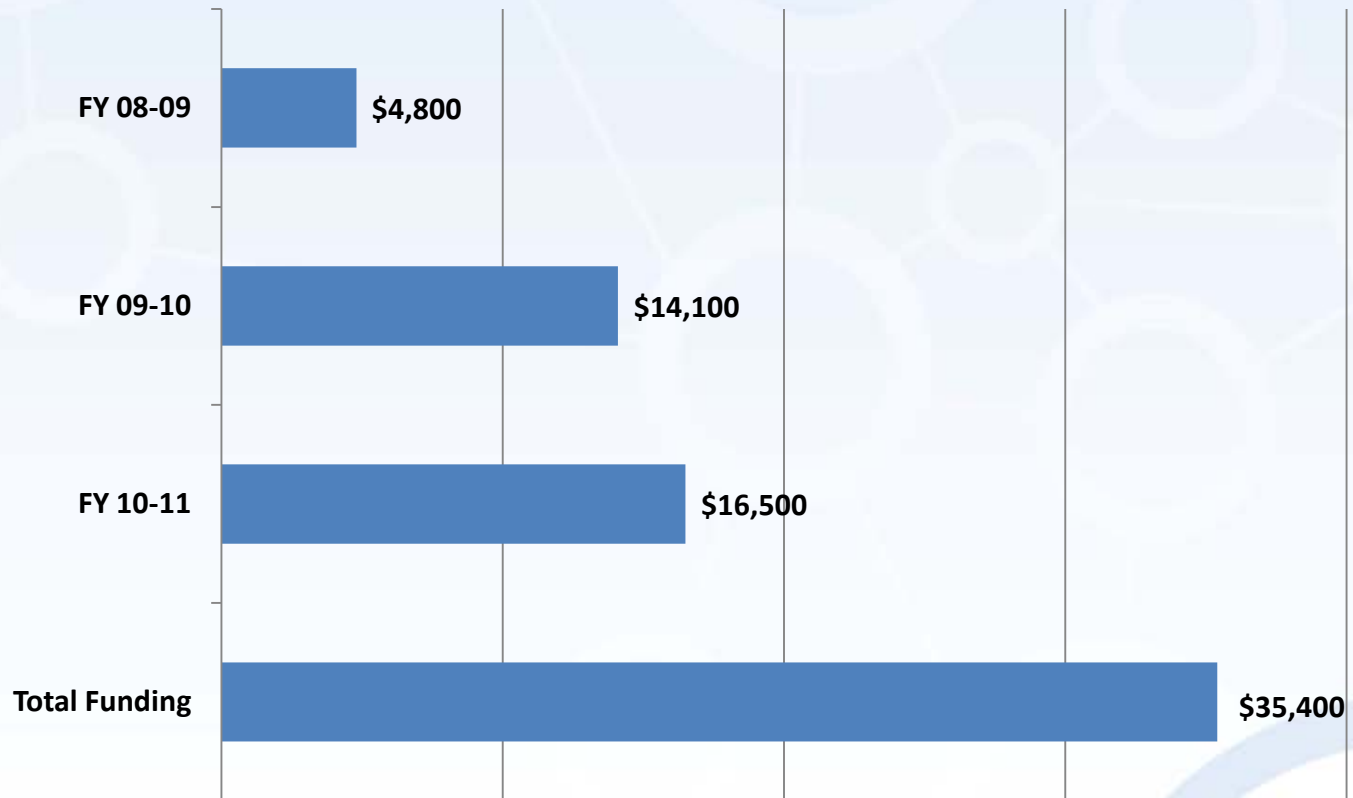
