and nursing faculty. Through extensive cooperation and collaboration among TBR colleges/schools of Nursing, students can earn Master's degrees and Post Master's certificates from:

Austin Peay State University (APSU) School of Nursing
East Tennessee State University (ETSU) College of Nursing
Middle Tennessee State University (MTSU) School of Nursing
Tennessee State University (TSU) School of Nursing
Tennessee Technological University (TTU) School of Nursing
Loewenberg School of Nursing at the University of Memphis (UoM)

Each institution offers the same curriculum, and all courses are taught by qualified faculty from the universities.

Nursing Administration

Program Overview:

The Nursing Administration concentration prepares nurses for executive leadership roles within hospitals, clinics, nursing homes, hospices and other healthcare facilities. It focuses on developing your knowledge of

management principles, human resources, finance, ethical/legal issues, communication and critical thinking skills which are becoming increasingly important as the nursing practice grows in complexity.

Nursing Education

Program Overview:

Since many faculty members within postsecondary educational institutions are nearing retirement, there is strong demand for new nurse educators to fill the increasing number of open positions. This program

prepares nurse educators for responsibilities in designing course curricula, evaluating student progress and facilitating student learning in a postsecondary setting.

Nursing Informatics

Program Overview:

Nursing informatics facilitates the integration of data, information and knowledge to support patients, nurses, and other providers in their decision-making in all roles and settings. This support is accomplished through a combination of nursing science, computer science and

information science. The Nursing Informatics concentration prepares students for careers in analyzing, managing and evaluating healthcare information systems and interpreting the data generated by these systems.

Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP)

Program Overview:

An outstanding future awaits registered nurses who seek to advance their careers by continuing their education and becoming a nurse practitioner. There's high demand for more nurse practitioners, particularly

in medically underserved populations residing in inner cities and rural areas. This online program focuses on the specialty areas of family practice, adult practice, women's health, pediatrics and geriatrics.

Bridge Option

Program Overview:

Registered nurses with Bachelor degrees in fields other than nursing now have the opportunity to be considered for admission to the Master of Science in Nursing program. RNs with non-nursing Bachelor

degrees must complete a 12 semester hour bridge of four theory courses before taking courses in the Master's degree program specialty areas.

Family Nurse Practitioner Post Master's Certificate Program

Program Overview:

This program provides formal study for Master's-prepared nurses interested in taking the national certification exam to practice as a Family Nurse Practitioner. To be eligible for the certification exam, students must successfully complete graduate didactic and clinical requirements of a Master's nurse

practitioner program through a formal graduate-level certificate or Master's-level Nurse Practitioner program in the desired area of practice. The FNP Certificate program meets the need for students who already have the Master of Science in Nursing degree without requiring them to complete a second Master's degree.

As a Nursing student, the Virtual Library provides you with access to:

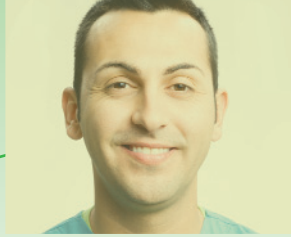

Getting Started – The Application Process

Application to the Nursing program is a two-step process.

STEP ONE:

Complete an MSN application to Regents Online. This application is reviewed by the Executive Committee for admission referral and random home campus assignment.

Random home campus assignment only applies to students residing in designated Middle Tennessee counties. Applicants must wait for notification of home campus assignment before applying to the Graduate Division of a participating university.

STEP TWO:

Upon notification from the Executive Committee, you must apply and complete the admission process to the graduate division of your assigned home campus. Official admission notification is forwarded by the graduate division of the home campus to each candidate. Following admission to the university, students may enroll in courses.





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
